1. 2019 AGM reports from the committee were all posted on the HSRA website for review after the 2019 AGM.

2. Chairman's report was presented: the financial highlights were that enhanced ES membership status has been achieved and resulted in an extra £3000 annual rebate to HS. The loss of Summer League Squash has had a negative impact on funding, as will a delay in the Winter League and the extensions to ES membership.
3. Junior Chairman's report was presented: it was a great year for the juniors in terms of on court performance and the programs encouraging participation. Andrew also announced his intention to stand down from the committee as soon as a replacement can be found. During my term as Chairman, Andrew has been fundamental to the huge success of junior squash in the county.
4. The CDO report presented the "Vision", "Mission" and strategic plan. The progress of the plan was also summarised.
5. The racketball report: Dave Moore and Stew Chandler will be stepping down from the committee and Mark Millard and Dilip Chakrabarti will take over. Huge thanks were given to Dave and Stew who've given so much to the growth of racketball in the county and leave it in a very healthy situation.
6. League Organiser Report: unfortunately, the coronavirus pandemic cut the season short. Due to the uncertainty of when squash can fully resume, it's difficult to decide on how to resolve the leagues. Now, it looks likely that resumption of competitive squash is some months away and the remaining games may not be played. Many of the relegation and promotion places had already been decided.
7. The county closed tournament was a great success and had more participants than last year. The target is to promote even greater participation this year, although a date for the tournament cannot be determined yet.

8. Trev Leahy, Jonathan Graham, Mark Millard and Dilip Chakrabarti have all joined the HSRA committee.
9. The “Back to Squash” discussion was very informative with all attendees contributing. As of the date of the AGM, the clubs that have opened their courts for limited play are Winchester, Chichester, Totton, David Lloyd’s and Trojans. Fair Oak, Avenue and Abshot are due to open shortly, whilst Nuffield, Petersfield, Romsey, Five Rivers and the other leisure centre based club’s courts remain closed.

Fair Oak have asked the members to monitor squash court use and hygiene. Avenue are considering something similar. Avenue are also making a video for “safe us of squash courts”, and will make this available to other clubs.
